## Reading of the Law (Resp.) – Exodus 20:13; WSC 67-69

Which is the sixth commandment?

***The sixth commandment is, You shall not murder.***

What is required in the sixth commandment?

***The sixth commandment requires all lawful endeavors to preserve our own life, and the life of others.***

What is forbidden in the sixth commandment?

***The sixth commandment forbids the taking away of our own life, or the life of our neighbor, unjustly, or whatsoever tends to that.***

## **Confession of Sin (Unison) – From Psalm 51:1-4**

*Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion, blot out my transgressions.*

*Wash away all my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.*

*For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.*

*Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight,*

*so that you are proved right when you speak, and justified when you judge.*

## **Assurance of Pardon – Isaiah 53:5-6**

He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

## **Scripture Reading – Romans 12:9-21**

<sup>9</sup> Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. <sup>10</sup> Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. <sup>11</sup> Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. <sup>12</sup> Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be

constant in prayer. <sup>13</sup> Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.

<sup>14</sup> Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. <sup>15</sup> Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. <sup>16</sup> Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. <sup>17</sup> Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. <sup>18</sup> If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. <sup>19</sup> Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, “Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.” <sup>20</sup> To the contrary, “if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head.” <sup>21</sup> Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
